

Lenten Regulations

Abstinence from meats is to be observed by all Catholics 14 years old and older on Ash Wednesday and on all the Fridays of Lent. **Fasting** is to be observed on Ash Wednesday by all Catholics who are 18 years of age but not yet 59. Those who are bound by this may take only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted.

By the threefold discipline of fasting, almsgiving, and prayer the Church keeps Lent from Ash Wednesday until the evening of Holy Thursday. All of the faithful and the catechumens should undertake the serious practice of these three traditions. Failure to observe penitential days totally or a substantial number of such days must be considered serious.

Lenten Study of the Passion of Jesus According to John

Thursday Evenings during Lent at 7:00 PM in the Parish Hall

Each Good Friday we hear, proclaimed, John's version of the Passion of Jesus. It contains drama, dialogue, deception, dissertation, and death. Jesus speaks for the last time with the disciples about service, his mission, the kingdom, and the Father. We hear his final prayer for his disciples, believers and, through the millennia all of us. Jesus' final hours show us a vision of God we all need to experience.

Thursday, March 7, 2019, at 7:00 PM in the Parish Hall, we will meet for the first time. We will read, pray and discuss the texts. We will discover the meaning of the words, movements, symbols, and dialogues contained within the texts. Our study will culminate in the celebration on Good Friday of the Passion of Jesus.

Way of the Cross — Fridays at 7:00 PM

One of the great traditions of Lent is to make a pilgrimage praying and reflecting on the scenes of Christ's passion and death. Each week we meditate at the individual *Stations of the Cross* in our church



as we reflect together in prayer on our Savior's suffering and death. In this penitential season of renewal and sacrifice it joins us with Christ in our own sacrifices as we live his Paschal Mystery in the dying and rising and the new life he has won for our world and each one of us.

St. Joseph's Table —Saturday, March 16th, 2019




