

TRANSFORMED BY THE RESURRECTION

Alleluia! Christ is risen! Imagine the flood of emotions that Mary of Magdala must have experienced on that first Easter morning. Grieving and yet determined to visit the place where Jesus' body had been laid, Mary would have been stunned to find the tomb empty. Imagine Simon Peter and the other disciple who, upon hearing Mary's announcement, ran to see for themselves. On Easter, we hear the story of Jesus' resurrection as though for the first time, through the account of Mary's discovery and the testimony of Peter who powerfully shared Christ's Paschal Mystery. We, too, have come to believe through their faithful witness. We are called to seek what is above, turn away from sin, and live as people who are forever transformed by the Good News of Jesus' resurrection.

STEP OUT IN FAITH

Mary ran to tell Simon Peter and the other disciple that the tomb was empty. No doubt confused and concerned, Peter and the other disciple set aside whatever fear might have occurred to them and ran to see the tomb for themselves. We do not always understand God's ways. We too are confused at times; our lives are marked by moments of uncertainty, and at times we are afraid. We can learn from Mary, Simon Peter, and the other disciple and step out in faith, trusting that we will find the Lord in the midst of the circumstances of our lives. When life gets complicated, as it often does, the best thing to do is step out, perhaps even run to the Lord!

BEAR WITNESS

We may not have opportunities to address crowds of people and share the gospel with them. Still, we are called to bear witness to our faith in the ways that we are able, in word and in deed. We cannot share what we have not fully embraced ourselves, however. The Easter season is the perfect time to reflect on Christ's Paschal Mystery, the unfathomable love of Jesus who shows and shares God's love perfectly. Our Lord gave his life so that we might have life, and have it to the full. Christ's victory over sin and death is our victory, our promise of eternal life with God in the fullness of time. See in Christ's life, passion, death, and resurrection the sign of God's mercy. Let this Easter day be a moment in which you allow yourself to be touched by Christ's incredible, undying love. Then, renewed in faith, look for ways to bear witness to the mercy, forgiveness, compassion, and love of the Lord with others.



From RMD to QCD

The Problem: Don't let your age (being over 70 ½) and needing to take a Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) from your Traditional IRA each year mean higher taxes. It was that way for me until I finally got smart. For years, I deposited my RMD in my savings. I used some of it to live on and gifted other parts of that money to my Church and other charities. Then I realized that money **coming to me** was really driving up my taxes to Uncle Sam's IRS.

The Solution: Now I start each year by learning the size of my RMD. An RMD is the amount of money which MUST BE WITHDRAWN from a traditional IRA before December 31 of that year, or the owner of that IRA faces a 50% penalty tax to the IRS. Knowing the amount, I determine how much I will really need for my expenses. The balance I give to charitable organizations like Divine Savior, the Annual Catholic Appeal, other religious organizations, medical charities for heart disease, cancer, etc., and entertainment venues like museums, orchestras, operas, and so on. It is important to be certain or to verify whether such receiving organizations are truly an IRS charitable deduction (501(c)(3)). Be aware that if the IRS does not recognize the name on the check as a bona fide charitable organization, then that money is taxable to you. That done, tell your financial institution that you want to use your RMD to make a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD). Your financial institution will ask you for specific information concerning the amount and the name of the venue you want to go on the check, or you may be asked to complete a form giving that information. Once the name of the charity and amount are on the check, your financial institution will either mail it directly to the charity or mail it to you for you to send it to the charity.

The Benefit: That money is NOT taxable to the donor as income, thus lessening the amount of your taxes. Your charity is helped, so be generous. **However**, you (the donor) are NOT able to take that contribution as a charitable deduction on your taxes. It has been my experience that a regular charitable deduction compared to my QCD never resulted in lowering my taxes as much as NOT having that RMD amount charged as income in the first place. So I say it again: be generous to the charity.


