New Family Registration 2019-2020

Registration is open for new families who wish to enroll in our Family Centered Faith Formation Program.

Parents and children from Pre-K through Grade 8 will meet monthly, from September-May, for family formation sessions centered on a particular theme drawn from the pillars of our Catholic faith. This year we will begin using the Loyola Press *Finding God* Family Catechesis program.

Parents and children will continue to pray and learn together during the month as they complete the monthly theme related materials together in their own homes. Each child will receive a grade level workbook from the *Finding God* series. The themes across all grade levels are the same, allowing parents to work together with their children as they complete age appropriate materials in their workbooks. Each child will also complete interactive assessments online as they finish the monthly sessions in their workbooks.

Focus on service activities as another component of our FCFF program will encourage all of our families to take an active role in living their faith through outreach to others in our community.

Families participating in FCFF who have children ready to prepare for sacraments will participate in additional formation sessions for sacramental preparation for First Reconciliation, First Eucharist, and Confirmation.

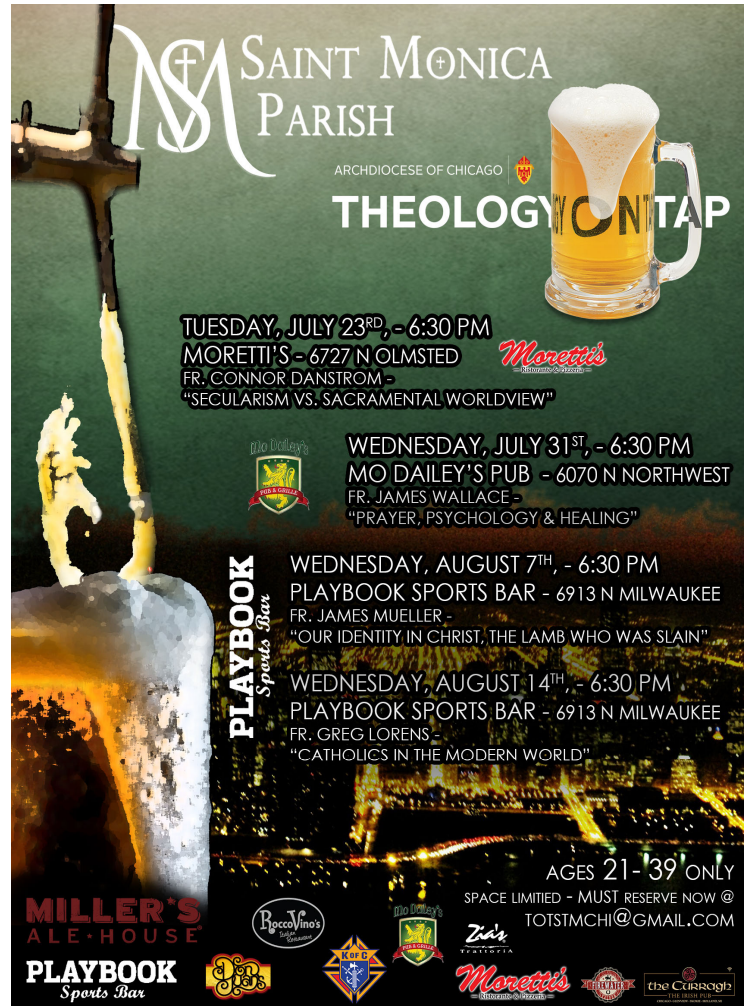

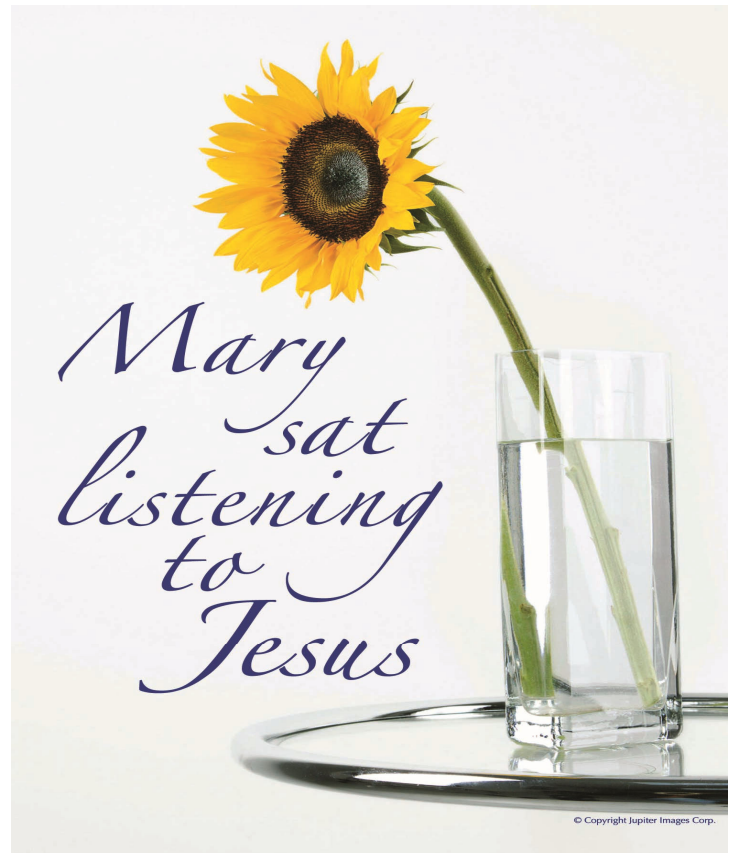

The Better Part

The Gospel for this Sunday can sometimes give the impression that Jesus favored Mary over Martha. But if they had both sat down to listen, there would have been no dinner to serve to Jesus. He saw that Mary was content to listen to him, so Martha could have been content to prepare the meal for him. Remember the first reading, in which Abraham insisted on serving the visitors, whom he came to recognize as the Lord and two angels. He was rewarded with the assurance that he would soon have a son.

So simple acts of hospitality can also be how people can welcome the Lord into their homes. When we welcome someone into our homes as a visitor, or into our lives as a friend, we are also welcoming Christ. When we get to know someone better, we are also getting to know Christ. And what about that "better part" that Mary had chosen? Are we sometimes like Martha, with too many things on our minds to be aware of the Lord? Sometimes we can't avoid the distractions that are part of life. But if we keep the Lord on our minds we may be able to see which are distractions to be put aside, and which are opportunities to serve the Lord in a different way. As we spend more time with the Lord in prayer, we begin to experience God's peace, which gives us the ability to choose the better part.

Treasures From Our Tradition

As the saying goes, ignorance of the law is no excuse. That is what Moses is telling the people in the first reading. The laws of God are not difficult to understand. Anyone with a conscience should be able to live with them.

By the time of Jesus, the scribes and Pharisees had added many more laws. The scholar who questioned Jesus about eternal life knew what was important: loving God with all your being and loving your neighbor as yourself. If he had stopped there, he would have been all right. But by asking "Who is my neighbor?" he implied that there are limits to love.

Even today, we find people making excuses for not doing what God asks of us. We judge people who need help, saying they choose to be poor or homeless. We sign our kids up for so many sports that we don't even go to church on Sundays. Before you start beating yourself up with guilt, remember that God expects us to take care of our families, to spend time with our children, and even to take time to rest and relax. If we are willing to look at our lives and bring them to God, asking for guidance, we are making the first steps to keep God's law of love.

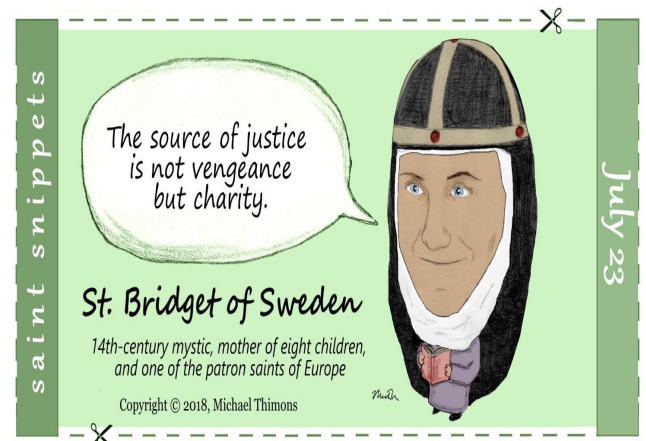
