An Important Message from The Archdiocese Regarding our Present Health Concerns

The Archdiocese is closely monitoring the news regarding Coronavirus (COVID 19) and is adhering to all guidelines issued from the US Center for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) which are listed below.

In addition, they have informed us of their own protocols and have asked us to implement two changes in our liturgical practices immediately. Effective beginning this weekend until further notice:

- * **The Sign of Peace will be exchanged verbally without physical contact;**
- * **Because of the increased inherent risk at this time with the accidental transfer of saliva, the distribution of Communion of the Cup is suspended until further notice and every consideration should be given to receiving Holy Communion reverently in open hands for the present time.** St. Cyril of Jerusalem said, "make your left hand a throne for the right, as for that which is to receive a King. And having hollowed your palm, receive the Body of Christ, saying over it, Amen."

Here are the specific guidelines and recommendations from the CDC during this serious time for our nation and community:

- Though an outbreak is a serious public health threat, **the immediate risk to the general public is considered low;**
- By contrast, the flu virus is very active this time of year so preventative measures must be taken to reduce this risk. Stay home if you are sick and if you have a fever, remain home for at least 24 hours after your fever is gone;
- If you or a family member has traveled outside the US to any of the Level 2 countries (China, Iran, Italy, South Korea, Japan) between February 10, 2020, and today, alert your workplace so appropriate precautions can be taken;
- Wash your hands with soap and water for at least 20 seconds often and use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer at least 60% alcohol;
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth with unwashed hands;
- Avoid close contact with people who are sick;
- Cover your face if you cough or sneeze and discard used tissues immediately;
- Clean and disinfect frequently touched surfaces often;
- **Hand-sanitizer is available at the rear of the church--please use it as you ENTER AND EXIT Mass during this time until further notice.**

Please pray for those stricken, their caregivers, and for wisdom for those working on identifying a vaccine for this debilitating illness. Thank you.
